Helping Families Access Quality Child Care

The Child Care and Development Block Grant (CCDBG) is a federal program that allocates funds to states to assist low-income families in affording child care. Through this program, low- and middle-income families receive subsidies to cover the cost of sending their children to a qualifying center. Child care centers receiving funding must perform background checks on employees and meet health and safety, training, and inspection standards.

The result? Children receive an enriching environment so they start kindergarten ready to succeed. Parents are able to work, building greater economic stability for their families.

Businesses benefit, too. At a time of record low unemployment, businesses need more workers. When parents have stable child care, they are able to fully participate in the workforce.

The Unmet Need

Congress increased funding for CCDBG, resulting in states being able to improve quality and clear waitlists. Unfortunately, half of eligible families still don't receive support. That leaves families scrambling and can result in parents having to make tough choices about whether it's worth it to work.
